\$50,000 in Damage Asked Auto Death

A suit for damages totaling \$50,604.26 has been filed in district court at Plattsmouth by Charlotte Stevens of Lincoln. special administrator and widow of Staff Sergeant Donald B. Stevens, who died following a traffic collision on U. S. Highway 34 a year ago. Defendant named in the suit was the Kelly Well company.

According to the petition, Mr. Stevens was driving his car east on Highway 34 in Cass county last December when it was in collision with a truck owned by the Kelly Well company, driven by Gerald A. Gibbs, an employe. Sgt. Stevens is survived by his widow and a daughter.

A former Plattsmouth youth, James Thomas LaRosee, 19. of Saturday Afternoon Omaha, has confessed to the murder of Cab Driver Erick William Burkwist for \$17 and to setting a 100 thousand dollar blaze at an Omaha carpet factory. LaRosee will probaby face a charge of first degree murder, officer said.

LaRosee told Omaha police he robbed the cab driver to pay his rent and set the fire for revenge after he was fired.
