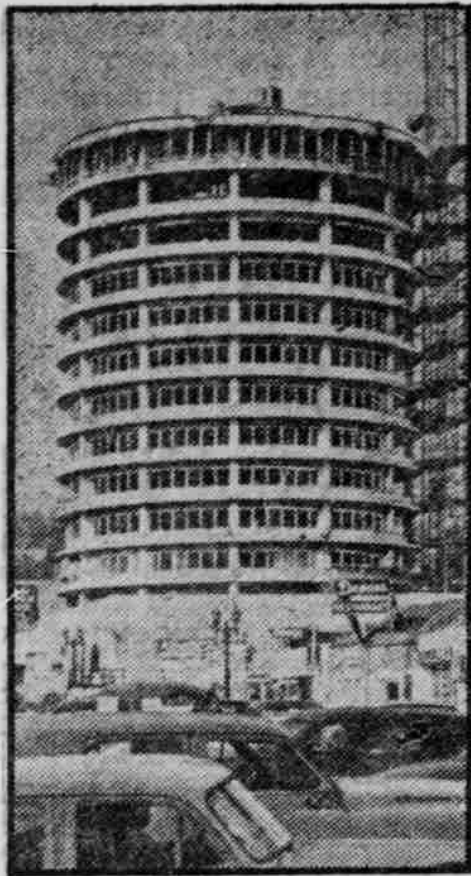

NAVY DRAFT DOWN
 A "better than expected" enlistment rate indicates the Navy will need to draft less than half the men it had thought it would need between the first of the year and next June, according to Charles S. Thomas, Secretary of the Navy. This means that the expected draft of 50,000 men in the first six months of this year will be cut to around 25,000.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported a drop of 3 per cent in the consumer price index between mid-November and mid-December, the first decline since last August.
