ORDINANCE NO. 937

AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 132 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA, DEFINING ITS BOUNDARIES AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN STREETS BY APPLICATION OF ASPHALTIC OIL; AND SUCH OTHER WORK AS MAY BE INCIDENTAL THERE-TO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska:

Section 1. The Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, hereby find and declare that it is in the best interests of the said city to create Street Improvement District No. 132.

Section 2. There is hereby created within the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, a Street Improvement District to be known and designated as Street Improvement District No. 132, the outer boundaries of which are as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the east property line of Fourteenth Street and the south property line of the east and west alley in Block 37, Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence south along the east line of Fourteenth Street to its intersection with the north property line of Block 1, Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence west along the north property line of said Block 1, Hays Addition, to the northwest corner of Lot 7, Block 1, Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence south along the west property line of said Lot 7, Block 1, Hays Addition, to its intersection with the north property line of said Block 1, Hays Addition;

Thence west along the north property line extended of said east and west alley in said Block 1, Hays Addition, to its intersection with the east property line of Fifteenth Street;

Thence north along the east property line of Fifteenth Street to its intersection with the south property line of the east and west alley running through Block 24, Duke's Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska;

Thence east along the south property line of said east and west alley in said Block 24, Duke's Addition, and said Block 36, Young and Hays Addition, to the place of beginning.

Section 3. The following street within said Street Improvement District shall be and hereby is ordered improved by the application of asphaltic oil, to-wit: **SECOND AVENUE**, also known as Granite Street, from the east property line of Fourteenth Street to the west property line of Fifteenth Street.

All work essential for or necessarily incidental to the construction of said improvement shall be done in connection therewith as a part thereof.

Section 4. All of said improvements shall be constructed to the established grades as fixed by ordinance of said city and shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications to be made by Elmer Gochenour, Special Engineer employed by the city and to be approved by the council. Said improvement shall be made at public cost but special improvement assessments on the specially benefited property shall be levied to reimburse the city to the extent provided by law.
