Mrs. Eva Kerns is confined to bed with the flu.

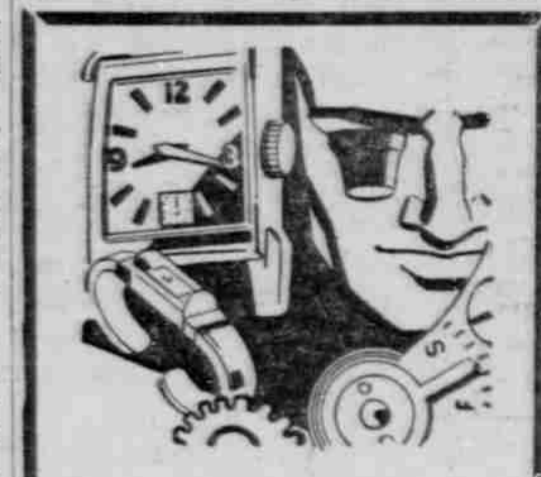
Lincoln T. and T. Honors Area People
