## Airman On Leave

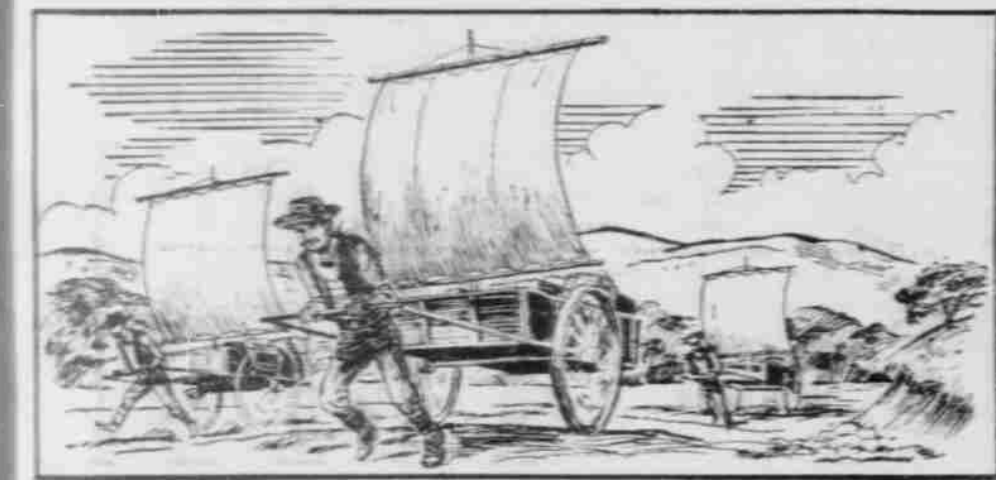
