bility for any improper persons entering the court house through the controversial door.
The sheriff complained the commissioners should have gone to him in the very beginning and settled the issue before the door was barred.

At several different times the sheriff hinted he would do away with his nighttime hours program set up only recently to offer radio-telephone protection both in the city and out in the county.
However, commissioners assured the sheriff they were in no way critical of the procedures of his office and felt he was doing a "wonderful" job.
The move is aimed at increasing the security of the court house the commissioners explained, and it was felt the move could be accomplished best through locking the door.
John Beckman, court house custodian, told commissioners he found people loitering in the court house after hours—and they told him they got in by the door near the sheriff's office.
The sheriff claimed the door leading into his office from the outside was a general access doorway and it was not his duty, but that of the custodian to make certain it was locked. Mr. Beckman disagreed.
The sheriff also suggested the commissioners could authorize installation of bathroom facilities in his office, but the idea was dropped after commissioners offered him a key.
