Bible Comment:

Wise Hands Guided the Early Church

ONE is impressed with the way in which the early Christians went about solving problems of administration of their religion. Perhaps the most notable thing is that they went so directly to first principles and to the basic experience of the Gospel. Many converts had not been brought up in the Jewish way. They did not understand the significance or the need of rites to which the Jews had been accustomed, which were deeply imbedded in their religious practice and which the Jewish Christians continued to practice along with what they deemed their newer and larger experience. Should these practices be enjoined on the Gentile Christians? The wise leaders among the Jews said that they should not. In brief, the requirement became that the Gentiles should practice the Christian way, that they should not give offense to their Jewish brethren by obtrusive disregard of Jewish customs, but that neither should they be under obligation to adopt these customs except as their own consciences should direct.
