 Constitutional amendment to change the allocation of fines and penalties for violation of laws prohibiting the overloading of vehicles used upon the public roads and highways of the state.

**TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,  
 Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1956, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following new section to Article VIII of the Constitution of Nebraska, to be known as section 10, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:  
 "Sec. 10. Notwithstanding the other provisions of Article VIII, the Legislature is authorized to substitute a basis other than valuation for taxes upon grain and seed produced or handled in this state. Existing revenue laws not inconsistent with the Constitution shall continue in effect until changed by the Legislature."

**TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,  
 Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1956, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article VII, section 5, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:  
 "Sec. 5. All fines, penalties, and license money, arising under the general laws of the state, except fines and penalties for violation of laws prohibiting the overloading of vehicles used upon the public roads and highways of this state, shall belong and be paid over to the counties respectively, where the same may be levied or imposed, and all fines, penalties, and license money, arising under the rules, by-laws, or ordinances of cities, villages, precincts, or other municipal subdivisions less than a county, shall belong and be paid over to the same respectively. All such fines, penalties, and license money shall be appropriated exclusively to the use and support of the respective subdivisions where the same may accrue, except that all fines and penalties for violation of laws prohibiting the overloading of vehicles used upon the public roads and highways shall be placed as follows: Seventy-five per cent in a fund for state highways, and twenty-five per cent to the county general fund where the fine or penalty is paid."
