The ladies of the Legion Auxiliary are planning another youth party to be held some time in February. The first party was a huge success, held in December.

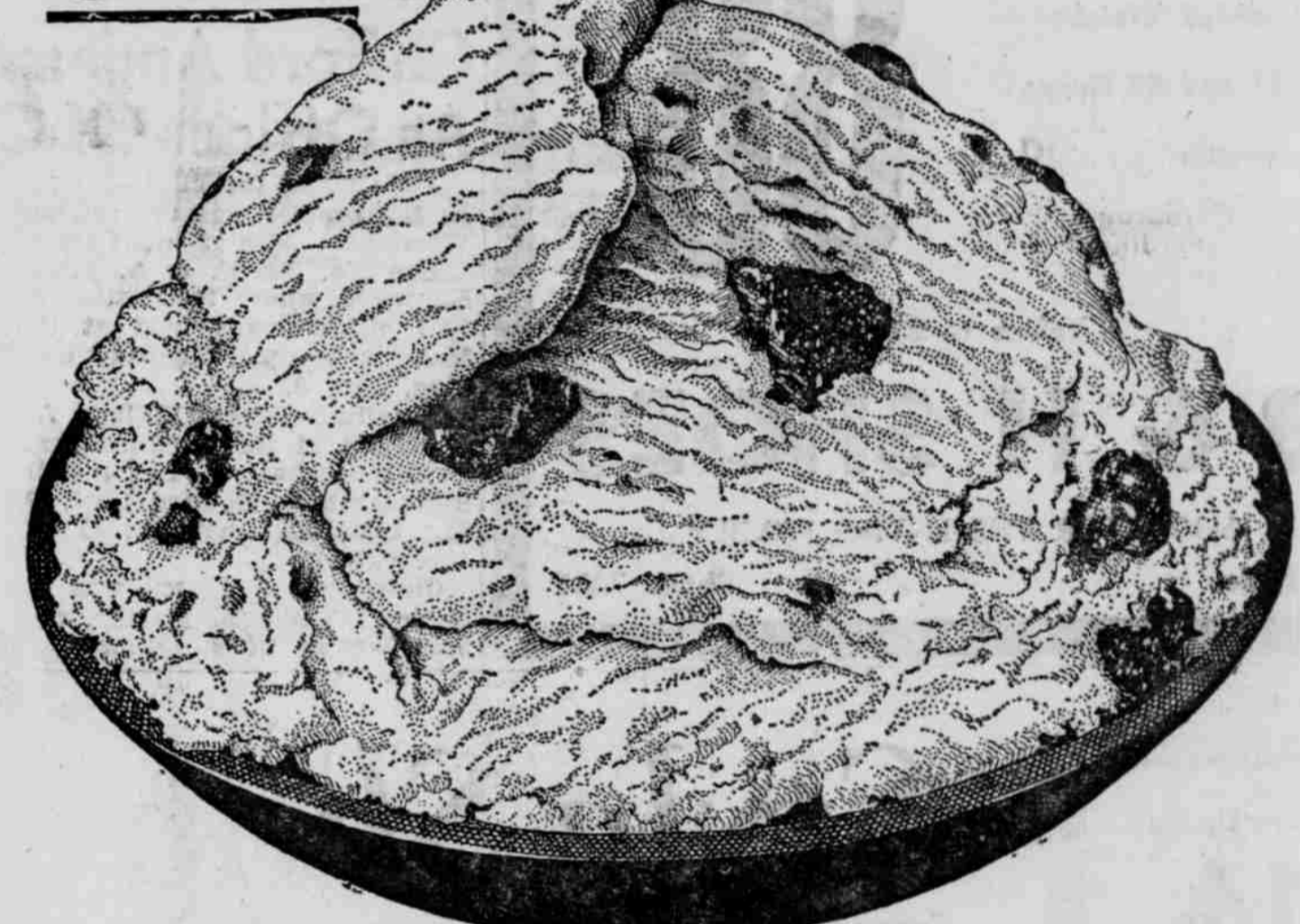
