Mental Patient Cost Boosted For Counties
Cass County taxpayers will have to dig deeper in their pockets after May 1 for the care of mental patients in state institutions, it was announced in Lincoln Tuesday.
An increase from \$3.90 to \$4.10 per day was voted by the Board of Control. Daily payments for the Beatrice State Home will be raised only five cents, from \$1.70 to 1.75 for daily care.
The increase in rates is due to rising costs of operations in the institutions. Jack Cheavenger, chief accountant for the Board of Control stated. These costs are figured each month and payments are adjusted periodically.
Under Nebraska law, operational costs for each patient in the institutions are paid for by the county from where they are committed. Cass County has 37 patients in state mental hospitals. Extra cost to this county will be about \$11 a day.
In addition to the mental institution patient list, Cass County also has 27 patients confined to the Beatrice State Home, which will add another \$1.33 per day to total costs.
This is the third increase in fees since December 1, 1955. Before that date the rate was \$2.90 a day in mental hospitals and \$1.50 at Beatrice.

Plattsmouth News Eighty Years Ago
The Daily Plattsmouth Herald in April 1870 had some very interesting items garnered from the little city on the banks of the Missouri River that are now of historic interest.
The Herald states: "Good residence lots can be had in this city from \$150 to \$250. A small dwelling house costing five or six hundred can rent easily from \$150 to \$200 a year."

Crop Picture In State Reported Much Better
State-Federal crop observers report that above normal temperatures and continued moisture favored growth of winter wheat, early seeded spring grain hay and pasture last week.
Winter wheat is still spotted in some counties, although the overall picture was characterized as one of vast improvement. Soil borne mosaic is affecting wheat in extreme southeastern Nebraska, but continued warm weather is expected to improve the situation.
Drier soils spurred field activity among farmers last week. Seeded preparation for corn and sorghum was general.
Around sixty per cent of the oats and barley were seeded at weekend compared with about 20 per cent the week earlier. Seeding of small grains was more than 90 per cent complete at this time a year ago. Alfalfa, wild hay and pastures were improved.
