Supreme Court Overrules \$40,000 Damage Suit Friday

The Nebraska supreme court Friday overruled a Dawson county district court decision in which Charles Terrance Egenberger was awarded \$40,000 damages in a personal injury suit. The case was remanded to Dawson county for a new trial. Egenberger, a minor, had brought suit through his father, Charles Egenberger, former Plattsmouth resident, against the National Alfalfa Dehydrating and Milling Co., and Leon Turner, a company employe, for injuries he alleged resulted from a collision between a car in which he was riding and a company truck driven by Turner. The company appealed the case to the supreme court after district court jury awarded damages to Egenberger, who had charged Turner with negligence. The supreme court ruled that one of the instructions the judge gave the jury, regarding the verdict to be reached if it was found that Turner was negligent, was "incomplete, conflicting, and misleading."
