The minimum wage paid to all labor employed on this contract shall be indicated in the proposal form.

Plans and specifications for the work may be seen and information secured at the office of the Department of Roads and Irrigation at Lincoln, Nebraska.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish bond in an amount equal to 100% of his contract.

As an evidence of good faith in submitting a proposal for this work, the bidder must file, with his proposal, a certified check made payable to the Department of Road and Irrigation and in an amount not less than nineteen thousand (\$19,000) dollars.
