Eleven Plattsmouth Residents Attending Omaha University

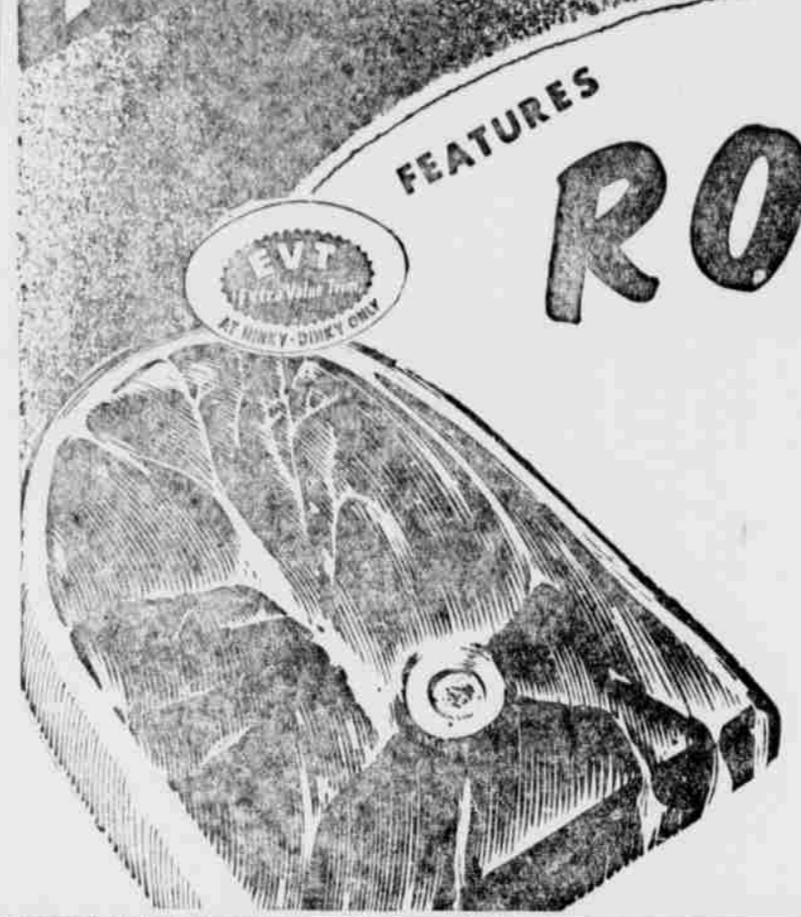
Eleven Plattsmouth residents are attending summer sessions at the University of Omaha. Summer enrollment reached 1,714, compared to 1,646 last year.
