SICKNESS COSTLY
Prolonged sickness costs the average worker in private industry 13 per cent of his annual income, according to a five-year study of non-occupational illness recently conducted. The average wage of the employees covered by the study was \$3,485 a year. Lost wages cost

the average worker \$323 and, in addition to this, he spent \$129 in medical costs. Benefits from group insurance plans do not cover the costs of illness to the worker. Almost 71 per cent of the benefits go for hospitalization and a little over 24 per cent for surgical care.
