#### **County Surveyors** Have To Register

The Nebraska attorney General ruled Wednesday that under the provision of LB 153, reficers elected here last week quiring the registration of surveyors, are fully applicable to county surveyors as they are

to other surveyors. The opinion was in response to the request of County Attorney Eugene C. McFadden of Madison County. The opinion was written by Assistant Attorney General Cecil B. Brubaker, said "no exception is made in the act for present county survey-

The bill passed by the 1957 Legislature requires the registration of all surveyors, a registration fee and posting of a five thousand dollar bond. Only exceptions are surveyors work-ing for the federal governments as assistants to registered sur-
