

Flu Seen as Cause as 228 **Students Miss Classes Here**

Absenteeism from school here Wednesday was 12 per cent in the public elementary schools, 13 per cent in high school and a little more than 50 per cent in St. John's Parochial School,

It was hard for school officials to determine how much of it may be attributed to illness or specifically to flu but it was certain that flu was a cause.

Normal absenteeism in the public schools is from 2 to 3 per cent, Supt. T. I. Friest said. * Numbers absent Wednesday


