THE DRIVER'S SEAT



Fall is the season for football, marching bands and the red, orange, purple and gold of leaves that cling in the trees or break loose to become a part of the panorama of color that splashes across the country side.
It's a nice time of the year. The kids are back in school and mom's tangled nerves are no longer shattered by the pestiferous demands of the youngsters throughout the day. Week-ends find the man of the house doing those outside jobs that need to be accomplished before winter comes.
A number of tweed jackets, a turtle-neck sweater or two and a few battered, but comfortable felt hats are seen on the streets. Pipes seem to be a bit more in evidence than they were during the summer months. People stroll instead of stride down the street. The relaxed feeling is everywhere.
After church on Sunday, the family probably will pile into the car and ramble over the back roads, olives and ahims at that patch of purple or the other grove of trees with its myriad colors a little farther up the valley.
There might be a brief expedition by the kids for some of the more beautiful leaves; or a hunt for prizes growing in the woods.
The weather and the season are right for driving — and many people in tens of thousands of cars will be enjoying an outing. Despite the easy-going air of relaxation that seems

to take hold of many phases of life at this time, people still rush when they are in the driver's seat. They rush to get to the country and, after they have had their outing, they rush to return home.
To heighten the danger of this highway impatience, the days are becoming shorter and shorter. The wonderful weather lures the driver into lurching a trifle too long in the country and dusk catches him on the road. The fading light and shifting shadows seem to cause the average fellow to tramp down a bit harder on the accelerator pedal, instead of acting as a slow-down signal occasioned by less visibility.
Darkness comes and he is really in a hurry to get home. Now, if it were a heavy rain-storm, dust or snow that was preventing him from seeing on down the highway, chances are he would slow down. But, if he is the average driver, the decreased visibility of this beautiful fall night will be ignored. As a result, more than half of our total accidents occur during these hours of darkness when there is less than a third of the daylight traffic on the road.
Try to be home before dusk. But if you aren't home, slow down and convert some of your day's relaxation to patience. It's the best way to get there after dark.
