## Saving Nature's Beauty

An interesting development took place near Stowe, Vermont, recently — involving highway signs and the beautiful scenery that prevails in this region. It seems that Bob Bourdon, a resident to Stowe, decided to take action against the growing number of highway signs in the area.

Bourdon, like so many others, feels that highway signs are marring the natural beauty of our countryside and thinks that something should be done to limit their presence or have them removed, on occasion. Thereupon, Bourdon began a one-man crusade.

He began with a list of some forty signs within the town limits of Stowe. Practically all of these signs were put up by local lodge or motel operators (Stowe is a famous skiing resort town.)

With the list of signs, Bourdon called upon the owners of the lodges and motels. He explained that the scenery the billboards were blocking was more valuable to the community than the billboards.

In almost every instance, the business men agreed to take down their signs if their competitors also took down their signs. With this accomplished, and with the aid of other town citizens, Bourdon led a group to the site of the various signs and tore them down as fast as he could.

We point this incident out because it could be used to advantage in other sections of the country. Or, learning the lesson from it, limits could be put on the erection of signs in certain areas — areas of natural beauty where the scenery should not be marred by more and more commercialization.

## The Commando

The adventures and exploits of the greatest commando leaders of World War I are back in the limelight, so to speak, as a new world threat bears down upon the United States. Those who remember the White Rabbit, in France, Otto Skorzeny, of the Mussolini rescue, and the SAS of the British Eighth Army, in Africa, under Colonel Stirling, or U. S. commando leaders and operations, will appreciate the growing importance of this type of warfare.

In the past, the leaders who touch off wars have largely gone unharmed by the enemy commando. The British tried to capture Field Marshal Erwin Rommel with a daring desert raid (in 1941 or 1942) but missed him.

But Hitler, Churchill, and other wartime leaders never faced a determined company of parachute commando raiders bursting through guards after dropping by parachute into their residence.

It may not be so next time. Books recently published on the exploits of the great commando leaders (notably "Commando Extraordinary") give the frank view that enemy headquarters, leaders and top staffs, will be the object of fast raiding parties in the next war — if there is one.

Had that been the case in World War I, and could the Allies have succeeded in killing Adolf Hitler, millions of lives might have been saved. For it was the will of this one man that kept Europe and the world at war after 1943, and Italy's surrender.
