Plattsmouth High, in first place in the Twin Rivers basketball Conference at I-C, will put its new double-post offense to the test when it steps outside the conference for a game Friday night at Pawnee City.

Coach John Adkins worked his boys on the twin pivot during the holiday vacation and more this week.

His aim is to get both center Tom Martin, 6-3 and J. D. Draper, 6-4 who has been alternating at center and forward, into the game at the same time with the best scoring opportunity possible.
