

LINCOLN - Grain sorghum with 15 to 16 per cent moisture may keep in a bin with out excessive damage until late March

or early April. However, the possiblities of the grain staying in good condition are much greater if the temperature is 40 degrees or lower, reports E. A. Olson, Extension agricultural engineer at
