

# 2 Games This Weekend For Plattsmouth High

Coach John Adkins' Plattsmouth High basketball team has its work cut out this weekend.

Friday night it's an Ak-Sar-Ben Conference game at Wahoo which walloped Ralston and lost a close one to Nebraska City its last times out; and Saturday night it's a Twin Rivers Conference game here against Nebraska City. (Nebraska City beat Shenandoah, Iowa, 59-48 Tuesday night. Adkins scouted the game).

And, the Blue Devils will be without 6-4 J. C. Draper whose illness turned out to be mumps. He'll be out a couple weeks at least.

All the news wasn't bad this week, however. Bob Hutton who suffered a sprained ankle against Lincoln Northeast last Friday, has responded well to treatment and may see some service Friday night.

Hutton worked out lightly Tuesday and Wednesday and Adkins was hopeful he'd continue to come along enough to be of help this weekend.

Friday, the Blue Devils will start with the same five who started last week. Tom Martin at center, Bill Long and Larry Cundall at forwards and Ken Dasher and Jim Shown at guards.

There'll be a big man for Plattsmouth to worry about again Friday night. Wahoo's center, Stu Veulek is 6-4 and is a scorer. He hit 29 points Friday night as Nebraska City nipped Wahoo 58-55 in the last minute at Nebraska City.

Martin, the Blue Devils' tallest at 6-3 with Draper out, thus has his assignment clearly defined.

Martin can also supply some trouble of his own since he's

Plattsmouth's leading scorer in games thus far.

In the Class A ratings, meanwhile Plattsmouth dropped from 8th to 10th after its 64-44 loss to Northeast. Tops is York followed by Omaha Holy Name, Lexington, Ogallala, Crete, Holdrege, Cozad, Gering, Falls City and Plattsmouth.

Friday and Saturday games are 8 o'clock for the varsity and 6:30 for the reserves.

With the coming of February the tempo of filings for the spring primary is now growing.

Edwin T. McHugh of Murdock has filed at the office of the secretary of state at Lincoln for state senator from the third district, comprising Cass and Sarpy counties.

The many friends over the two counties will be interested in learning that the Murdock banker and attorney at law will be on the ballot this year. He is well qualified for the position by education and experience.

Mr. McHugh is a graduate of the University of Nebraska college of law, establishing in practice at Murdock, after his graduation. He was one of the founders of the Corn Growers Bank at Murdock and has served since the start as cashier of the bank. His experience in business and the legal profession should fit him well for the unicameral at Lincoln.

He is a member of a pioneer Cass County family and has a wide acquaintance over the two counties.

This is the first filing for the state senate in this district that has been represented for the past term by Senator Tom Docley of Papillion.

## Martin Leads PHS In Cage Scoring

Center Tom Martin's 129 points in 12 games is high among Plattsmouth High basketball scorers so far this season. His 10-point average is also high.

Next high in total points and average is Guard Jim Shown with 109 points in 13 games for an 8.4 average. Center J. C. Draper has an 8-point average on 43 points in 11 games.

Forward Bill Long is averaging 7.2 points and Larry Cundall and Ken Dasher 6.2 points each.

Top efficiency in field goal shooting has been by Draper and Long with 49 and 48 per cent accuracy, respectively.

Other percentages are: Martin 37, Shown 33, Al Dasher 30, Ken Dasher 27, Bob Hutton 24 and Cundall 20.

Best free throwers are Shown with 25 for 35 and Martin with 35 for 55.

In 13 games (8 wins and 5 losses) Plattsmouth has scored 629 points to 553 for its opponents, at 48.4-45.8 scoring margin per game.

As a team, the Blue Devils have shot field goals at a 32 per cent clip to 35 per cent by their opponents.
