

Blue Devils Win, Lose, Host Bellevue Tuesday

Plattsmouth's Blue Devil basketball forces, at full strength for the first time in three weeks meets Bellevue here Tuesday at 8 p. m.

Plattsmouth will be seeking its 11th win against 7 losses after a weekend split with Ralston and Falls City.

The game Tuesday will mark the return to the lineup of J. C. Draper, the 6-4 pivotman who has been out with mumps.

Bellevue comes in hoping to reverse a 46-32 win by the Blue Devils last month in the Ak-Sar-Ben Conference tourney at Bellevue.

Last weekend, it was Plattsmouth over Ralston, 74-61, there and Falls City of Plattsmouth 67-41, here.

The Ralston game Friday, Coach John Adkins said today, was just a case of everything going just right. The course of the game allowed Adkins to play reserves a good share of the time and all but one of 12 players scored.

Larry Cundall was high scorer with 19 and Jim Shown got 10. Plattsmouth shot 400 on

24 for 60 to 24 for 66 and .366 for the Ak-Sar-Ben host.

Plattsmouth hit 26 points in a torrid third quarter when it shot 9 out of 14, a 643 clip.

In the Twin Rivers Conference here Saturday night, Falls City's well-trained and veteran team handled the ball too well and shot too accurately for the Blue Devils.

Jim Poage and Bob Gibson, touted as good shots, were just that, scoring 26 and 16 points respectively.

Not tall, Falls City displayed as much finesse as any team Plattsmouth has played this season. The starting lineup is veteran of two years together and showed it in neat play.

Cundall was high for the Blue Devils with 12 and Al Dasher scored 11.

While Falls City was shooting 400 on 28 for 70, Plattsmouth was freezing at 15 for 64, just .234.

That difference in shooting success (Plattsmouth working against a tight defense) proved Falls City with 18-8, 36-21 and 49-27 leads.

Saturday's game marked the return to action of Tom Winscot, veteran of last year's first Blue Devil team who was sidelined early in the football season with a broken leg.

The physician's OK for Winscot to play a few minutes at a time as long as no complications develop was received Saturday. Winscot played the last two and one half minutes of the varsity game as well as in the Reserve game. He scored 10 for the Reserves.

County Tourney, Conference Stars Named

Four seniors and a sophomore from four schools were named to the Cass County Basketball Tournament all-star first team by a vote of Cass County coaches.

Seniors are Gary McDonald, Weeping Water; Dan Workman, Louisville; Carroll Carsten, Avoca; and Ted Snyder, Nehawka. The sophomore is Doug Alfrey, Louisville.

The Cass County All-Conference team, named the same way, has three seniors, a junior and a sophomore from five schools.

Seniors are Carstens, Snyder and Robert Roelofs, Alvo. Junior is Robert Neben, Murdock, and sophomore is LaVane Johnson, Eagle.

Johnson was the only unanimous choice.

Louisville and Weeping Water, which don't play all conference schools in the regular season, were not eligible for all-conference selection.

Plattsmouth has drawn Pius X of Lincoln in the first round of the District One basketball tournament March 4-5, 7-8 at Nebraska Wesleyan University.

The game is at 8:30 p. m. that date, after Crete and Nebraska City have played at 7 o'clock.

The next night it's Seward vs. Fairbury and Columbus vs. Falls City to complete the first round. Semifinals are at 7 and 8:30 p. m. two nights later with Plattsmouth playing the Crete-Nebraska City winner at 7 if it wins in the first round.

The title game is at 7:30 March 8.

Seedings (arbitrary rankings of competing teams) are Crete 1st, Falls City 2nd, Seward 3rd and Plattsmouth 4th.

Ticket prices for the district meet are 50 cents for students and \$1 for adults.

its scoring flood began.

Louisville held Weeping Water to only four points in the second period and outscored it in the third, 13-3. The hit-and-run fourth quarter went to Louisville, 22 to 18.

Mike Stacy was high for Weeping Water with 11.

For Louisville, it was the second straight major upset in as many nights. Wednesday night it had ousted top-seeded Syracuse by a score of 52 to 43.

Syracuse had to settle for third place by beating Waverly, 66 to 40.
