## Family Life Is Important

(The following was prepared by the State of Nebraska, Department of Health).

Many educators, ministers, and others who have made a study of present day family life are concerned about the lack of unity within the family group. A few years ago the members of the family shared common tasks and spent many pleasant hours together in self-entertainment and other activities.

The varied activities of the different age levels in the modern family, with few common interests, have caused a lack of understanding and interest in what the individual members are doing. This tends to result in self-centeredness, with little consideration for the family unit.

A movement is planned which seeks to restore a family-centered interest. To accomplish this, units of instruction are given in the school, and recreational programs and family life activities are carried on by church and civic interest groups.

Important ways to build family unity and cooperation can be found in outings and vacations together, and in group recreation and sports.

Most churches now have active programs in family life education and activities which are affiliated in the state or district organizations of the given church.


