# NOTICE to TAXPAYERS

MARCH 1ST

IS THE ASSESSMENT DATE

The last date for making a return is April 20th. All schedules filed after the 20th day of April will be penalized 50% of the total valuation.

An assessor will call at the door of all persons in the county, with the exception of Plattsmouth City. Taxpayers in Plattsmouth City will make their return in the office of the County Assessor.

All items will be listed at actual value and taxed at 35% of that value.

The 1957 Legislative Bill 359 requires all Business Inventories to be listed on a separate schedule. The inventory schedule must be fully completed before the actual business schedule is made.

Legislative Bill 553 has repealed the former system of taxing grain. An excise tax will be based on the production of the 1957 Crop.

Please cooperate with the assessor as his time is limited.

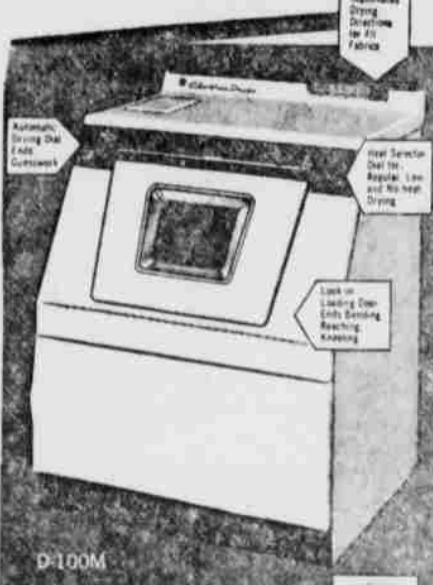
