Plattsmouth meets one of the better teams in the Platte Valley baseball league when it opens its South Division season here Sunday against Ralston.

South to the North Division this year, making room for Lincoln in the South half. All teams will play afternoon ball except Treynor and Millard.

PHS 5th in Team Totals At Bellevue

Plattsmouth finished 5th in a 10-team field and scored 19 points in Tuesday night's annual Bellevue Relays.

Westside won with 72 points to Nebraska City's 64½, 56 for defending champion, Bellevue, Blair 34, Plattsmouth 19, Nebraska Deaf 10, Papillion 9, Holy Name 8, Ralston 2½ and Missouri Valley 2.

Plattsmouth athletes' results were:

Roger Noell and Ron Toman each finished 4th in his heat of the 60-yard high hurdles, didn't place in the first five.

Plattsmouth's mile medley relay team ran 4th in its heat and had the 4th-best in the time comparison. Its two-mile relay team finished 4th in a one-heat race.

The Blue Devils won the 880-yard freshman relay with Lee Hackler, Larry Toothaker, Robert Piper and Jim Stewart running 1:42.1.

Noell ran 3rd and Toman 4th in the sections of the 100-yard low hurdles, failed to place in the time comparison for five places.

Plattsmouth won its section of the 440-yard relay in :47.3 with Don Pierce, Stewart, Tom Winscot and Ron Kruntorad running. The time was good for 4th place.

The Blue Devil 880-relay team of Ron Toman, Charles Toman, Hackler and Leonard Hild ran 1:39.7 for 1st in its section and took 4th place overall.

Plattsmouth finished second in its section of the mile relay, trailing Holy Name to the tape. Its time did not place.

Noell tied for 2nd in the high jump at 5-6.
