

Wohlfarth Hits 2 Homers In Loss

Plattsmouth had enough punch but was lacking in defense Sunday as it dropped a 13-11 decision to the Lincoln AFB Bombers at Lincoln in the Platte Valley baseball league.

The airmen won on a 9th inning 3-run homer off Sgt. Ed Blair after Plattsmouth had rallied for the 4th time to take an 11-10 lead in the 8th.

Rich Wohlfarth stroked a 3-run homer for Plattsmouth in the eighth, his second round tripper of the game but two walks and the counter-homer spoiled it in the home 9th.

Walks proved costly throughout the game for Plattsmouth. John Schuetz who went the first 8 innings was constantly in trouble. He issued 8 walks.

Wohlfarth hit his first home run with one on in the 2-run 5th. That tied it at 5-5. Plattsmouth had scored three in the 4th on 2 walks and singles by Dietrich and Doug Reno.

Lincoln got 5 in the 3rd on 3 walks, a single and home run. Next for Plattsmouth is a meeting here next Sunday with Gretna. Plattsmouth and Gretna are both 1-3 now.
