MAKES IT UNLAWFUL TO PERMIT WEEDS OR WORTHLESS VEGETATION TO GROW ON ANY LOTS, STREETS OR ALLEYS.

PROPERTY OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE
For cutting weeds to the CENTER of adjoining streets or alleys.

OWNERS ARE REQUIRED TO CUT THEM TWICE A YEAR
1. Between June 1st and June 30th.
2. Between August 10th and 31st.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT
Covering all machinery, labor and billing will be levied against your property for weeds cut by the city. Charges will be at the rate of \$5.00 per hour with a minimum billing of \$5.00.
