Melvin Shafer, pastor of the Myrnard E. U. B. Church conducted the services which brought comfort to the bereaved members of the family. Raymond C. Cook, of Omaha, a close friend of the deceased and her family, sang two solos, "In the Garden" and "No Night There", accompanied by Mrs. Della Rogers of Milford.
 Casket bearers were Robert R. Cole, Dick Keefer, Charles Samuelson, George Jacobs, James Chapman and Alan Slater, grandsons of the deceased. Burial was in the family lot at Alvo where a short graveside service was held and where a large number of old friends and neighbors had gathered to pay their last respects.
 Hannah Skiles-Keefer was born Sept. 10, 1867 near Madison, Wis., and departed his life Sept. 9, 1958, at the home of her daughter in Milford. Had death been delayed an hour or so she would have passed away on her ninety-first birthday.
