Farmers Asked To Help with Acreage Survey

Several thousand Nebraska farmers will be asked to help this month in the final surveys on acreage of farm crops harvested in the state.

A fall survey of crop acreage will be made during the last two weeks of October. A. V. Nordquist, State Agricultural Statistician, announced today.

The information which farmers give in this survey on the number of acres of corn, wheat, oats, soybeans, and other crops will be the basis for the final acreage figures used to determine production of crops in 1958. This fall's survey will cover the acreage planted to winter wheat

and rye also. Later on, after harvest of corn and sorghums is complete, a survey will be made to get information on yields of late harvested crops.

Postmasters and the rural mail carriers will cooperate in selecting farmers to receive the blank forms for the acreage survey.

"We hope," said Nordquist, "every farmer who receives a

blank card asking questions about his crops this fall will take a few minutes to fill out the form accurately and put it in his mailbox. The reports we get, and the more carefully they are filled out, the more accurate we can make the Nebraska estimates of acreage and crop production.
