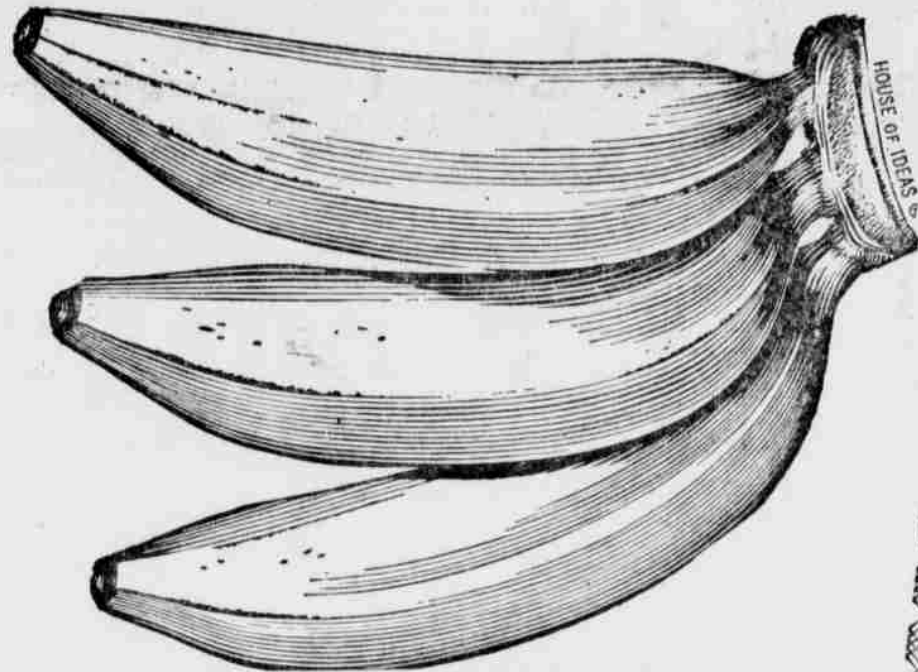

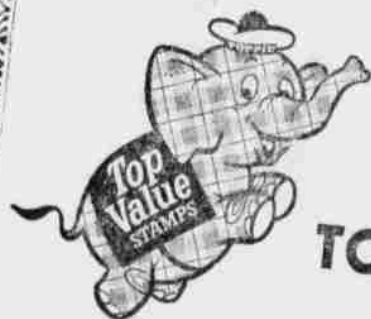

### Death Of Charles Teel Here Wednesday

Charles Teel, 79, died at his home, 701 North 9th street, Wednesday afternoon of a cerebral hemorrhage. He has been in failing health for the past thirteen years.
