Old Age Assistance Lien Not Assignable

An old age assistance lien is not assignable or transferable so it may be foreclosed by a private party assignee, the office of the attorney general at Lincoln ruled Thursday.

The opinion said there is no provision in the statutes which authorizes the assignment of a lien for old age assistance. Furthermore, the opinion said, the only party which the statutes designates as having authority to release such a lien is the county board of public welfare.
