She said the best protection against atomic or bombs is DON'T BE THEREwhich n ecessitates having a home shelter or following evacuation principles to a community shelter.

Three reason given for constructing a home shelter are: 1. in a sneak attack or where there is insufficient warning for evacuation, any refuge or shelter is better than none; 2. if you get area to be relatively safe from blast and fire, there still live far enough outside a tarmay be radioactive fallout from the bomb cloud; 3, home shell ers are good safey insurance against tornadoes or other types natural disasters.

An outdoor shelter covered by at least 3 feet of earth or concrete provides good protection against fallout. The best way to survive the hazards of radioactive fallout, Miss Dyer said., as well as any other threat an enemy may use is to be prepared. know the facts and learn what to do.
