Mrs. Anna Lee Haith had asked \$6,000 from the Prudential Insurance Co., in connection with her husband David's death. She has contended his death resulted from an accidental gunshot wound.

The insurance company contended Haith committed suicide and she therefore was not eligible to collect under the policy he carried.

Mr. Haith's death had been ruled a suicide by the sheriff's office.
