460 Ducks Tagged

LINCOLN — In its 12th consecutive year of banding, the Nebraska Game Commission tagged 460 ducks, mostly on the Sand Hills breeding grounds.

Of the banded ducks, 397 were non-flying ducklings, 51 were Canada-type geese, seven were white-fronted geese, three were coots and one was a sora rail. One of the geese had been banded at the same location the previous year and another had been released in Montana in 1957.

A dog, a retriever specifically trained for the work, caught 24 per cent of the ducks and accounted for others which he pointed but did not actually handle.
