Oscar H. Allen

Oscar H. Allen was born January 13, 1871, son of the late Benjamin F. and Harriett Ely Allen of Wabash. They lived in the Wabash community until 1913. He and his family moved to Omaha.

In 1897 Mr. Allen graduated from the University of Nebraska and during 1898 to 1899 he served as a Captain in Co. K, 3rd Nebraska Volunteer Regiment in Cuba during the Spanish American War.

February 12, 1902 he married Miss Myrtle M. McCrory at Wabash and they established their home near there.

From 1913 to 1926 Mr. Allen was associated with Snyder - Malone Livestock Commission firm as a salesman and later as part owner.

He had served on the Board of Directors of Omaha Stock Yards Exchange; and 1926-1954 he was in sales work with various book concerns and sold Encyclopedia Britannica, selling to public schools over a wide area near Omaha.

He had been in failing health for three years and in Nov. 1958 he and Mrs. Allen moved to McCook to be near their daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Rees.

Mr. Allen died Thursday morning, July 23 at the U. S. Veterans Hospital, Grand Island at the age of 88 years, six months and ten days.

Surviving is his wife, Myrtle and daughter Hope (Mrs. Charles Rees), both of McCook.

Funeral services were Saturday, July 25 at 11 a.m. at the Methodist Church, Elmwood with Reverend James Hansen officiating. Burial was Elmwood Cemetery.
