**Annual Appropriation Bill AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY BY MEANS OF TAXATION ALL THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING APRIL 30, 1960. SPECIFYING THE OBJECT OR PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; CONTAINING THE PERCENTAGE OR NUMBER OF MILLS LEVIED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; LEVYING A \$200 POLL TAX UPON EACH AND EVERY ABLEDODD MALE RESIDENT OF THE CITY NOT EXEMPT BY LAW; PROVIDING FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT.**

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska:

Section 1. Annual Appropriation Bill 1959 Made: Mill Levy for each object or purpose. There is hereby appropriated the following sums of money deemed necessary to defray by means of taxation all the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska for the fiscal year ending April 30, 1960, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of tax authorized to be levied. The objects or purposes for which such expenditures are to be made, the amount appropriated for each object or purpose and the corresponding percentage or number of mills levied for each object or purpose based on the total tax value of \$4,667,452.00 returned for said fiscal year, including all amounts due upon legal and valid outstanding bonds against said City and all special assessments and other taxes authorized by law, as specified as follows:

#### COUNCIL MINUTES Meeting of July 13, 1959 Council Chambers City Hall

City Council met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with the following present: Mayor Grant Roberts, Councilmen L. W. Moore, A. W. Huebner, Wm. G. Highfield, C. W. Rhylander, City Clerk Albert Olson. Absent: none.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Pursuant to published notice for calls for bids for a street sweeper, the following bids were on file: Highway Equipment & Supply Co. — \$8,293.00, \$11,370.00 both new, \$2,750.00, \$2,750.00 both used, D. D. and Equipment Co. — \$9,976.00, Interstate Machinery & Supply Co. New \$9,455.00, used — \$3,500.00, Construction Service Equipment Co. \$8,995.00. Motion carried that 10 days be taken to go over specifications before making a decision.

Mr. Andrew Epperson was present and submitted a plat of Ideal Heights, being a replat of Lot 17 in SE 1/4, SE 1/4 of Sec. 24, T. 12 N. R. 13 E. Motion carried that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to approve and execute the plat.

Paul Fauguet, Flood Control Act, was present and stated the dedication ceremony at Dam 10A on the Eden property west of town will be held on July 31st at 5:30 o'clock P.M.

Motion carried that the Audit report of the Board of Public Works for the year ending April 30, 1959 be accepted and placed on file.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF BINGO IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS TO CONDUCT BINGO GAMES; TO REQUIRE REPORTS AND TO IMPOSE A TAX ON THE GROSS PROCEEDS OF BINGO GAMES; TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATORS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DIVISION OF SUCH TAX AND TO REPEAL PRIOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH" was introduced and designated as Ordinance No. 978, same was passed under suspension of rules.

A petition signed by Bula Schade, Ward Schade and Marion Endelicate was read to and annex the following described real estate: Beginning at a point 820 feet east of the SW corner of the NW 1/4, Sec. 13, T. 12 N. Finney to excavate for sanitary sewer service to the property of Ruth and Co. described as Lots 1 to 4 in Bl. 22; in Avenue C for service to the property of Ray Story described as Lots 5 to 8, Bl. 12 in Young & Hays Add.; in Third Ave. for service to the property of James Begley described as Lot 1 East 15 ft. of Lot in Rubin's Add., subject to requirements.

Motion carried permission be granted to Harold Austin to tap on to the sewer running through the property of John G. Horn II described as the North half of Lots 7 to 10 in Bl. 95, subject to requirements.

Motion carried permission be granted to O. W. Finney to excavate in Thayer St. for sewer service to the property of Albert Young and Fay Jose described as Lots 7 & 8 in Bl. 2, Pleasant Hill Add., subject to requirements.

Motion carried that the City's share of the salary of the night radio operator be raised 25c per hour.

Motion carried that the Fire Department be authorized to purchase a spare type hose nozzle at a cost of approximately \$90.00.

Motion carried that the Police Judge reports for the weeks ending June 27, July 4 & 11th be accepted and placed on file.

Motion carried that Parking Meter collections for the weeks ending June 29, July 6 and 13 reported as \$207.00, \$169.00 and \$198.00 respectively be accepted.

#### City Council Minutes Meeting of July 20, 1959 Council Chambers City Hall

City Council met in special session at 7:30 P.M. at the call of the Mayor with the following present: Mayor Grant Roberts, Councilmen L. W. Moore, A. W. Huebner, Wm. G. Highfield, C. W. Rhylander, City Clerk Albert Olson. Absent: none.

The Mayor stated the purpose of the meeting was for receiving the plans and specifications and estimate of cost for the construction of street improvements in Street Improvement Districts Nos. 136, 137, 138, 140, 141, 142 & 143 as prepared by Henningson, Durham & Richardson, Inc., Special Engineers employed by the City and to take such action as the Council may deem advisable, and to transact any other business that may come before the City Council.

The Mayor stated the first order of business would be to consider the bids on a street sweeper that were laid over from the July 13th meeting. Motion carried that application of Marion Endelicate for a Class C honor license for place of business to be known as Winterset Inn located at Oak Street and Sunset Ave. be referred to the License Committee and that date of hearing be set for August 10th, 1959 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. and that notice of same be published.

The Streets, Alleys and Bridges Committee submitted a tabulation of the bids as received on a street sweeper and on the specifications of the various machines as bid, and after considerable discussion it was moved by Rhylander that the Council hold the bids until the regular meeting Monday, July 27th, 1959 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. in order that all of the Councilmen may review the machines in question. Motion carried.
