Baby Scalded In Bathtub Here, Dies

Richard Lee Sampson II infant son of Richard L. and Arlene Lapidus Sampson of this city, died Saturday morning at Children's Memorial hospital in Omaha as result of second and third degree burns and shock received Friday night at the family home in a bathtub accident.

He was born in Omaha Aug. 19, 1958.

The parents and relatives will have the deepest sympathy of the community in the tragedy that has come to them in the loss of the little 14 month-old son and grandson.
