Elmwood GI in North Carolina Army Exercise

FORT LEWIS, Wash. — Army Specialist Four James T. Jicha, 19, son of Mrs. Dorothea Jicha, Elmwood, Neb., is scheduled to participate with the 4th Infantry Division's 124th Signal Battalion in Exercise Dragon Head at Fort Bragg, N. C., Oct. 26-Nov. 9. Specialist Jicha and other battalion personnel will be flown to the North Carolina fort from their permanent location at Fort Lewis, Wash.

The 4th Infantry Division, a major Strategic Army Corps (STRAC) unit, constantly maintains an immediate readiness force for airborne deployment to any area in the world.

The exercise will mark the first time that STRAC forces have been operated as an integrated force with units deployed in a realistic nuclear combat area.

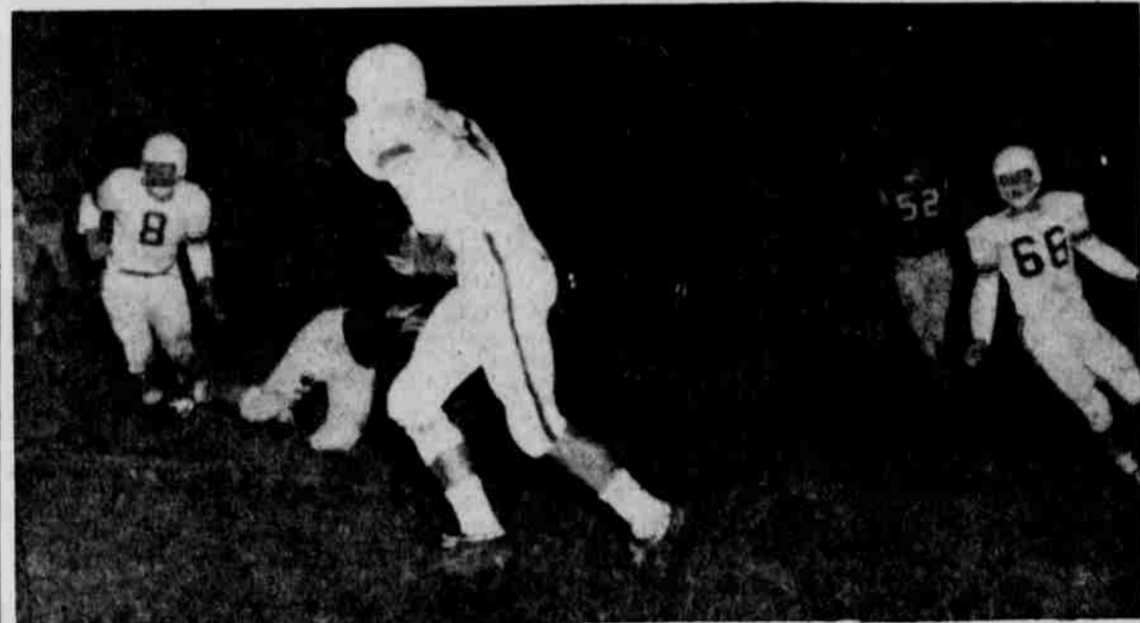

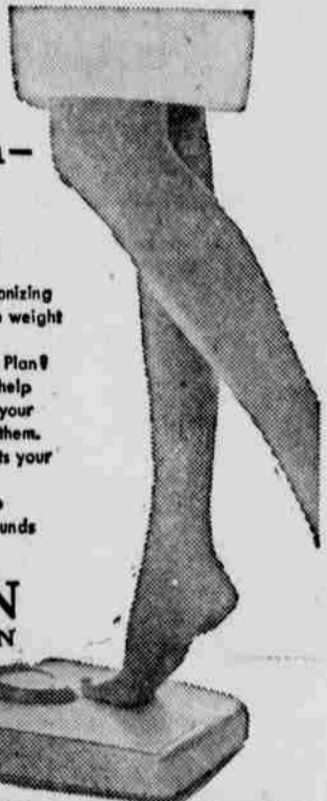

Plattsouth - Falls City Summary

1st Quarter
Plattsouth—Shown returned the kickoff to the 20, then lost a yard. Stewart lost 8. Dasher gained 8 and punted out on the Falls City 38.

Falls City—Harris gained six; Wilson and Noell stopped Sperry for no gain. Dasher threw Harris for a three yard loss; The punt rolled dead on the Plattsouth 31.

Plattsouth—Shown got one, Dasher 4. Plattsouth was penalized 5 and Stewart's pass was incomplete. Dasher punted.

Falls City—Harris returned from the 40 to 46. Sperry got 2. Christenson stopped Castle for no gain and Noell threw Harris for a 7-yard loss. Beasing punted.

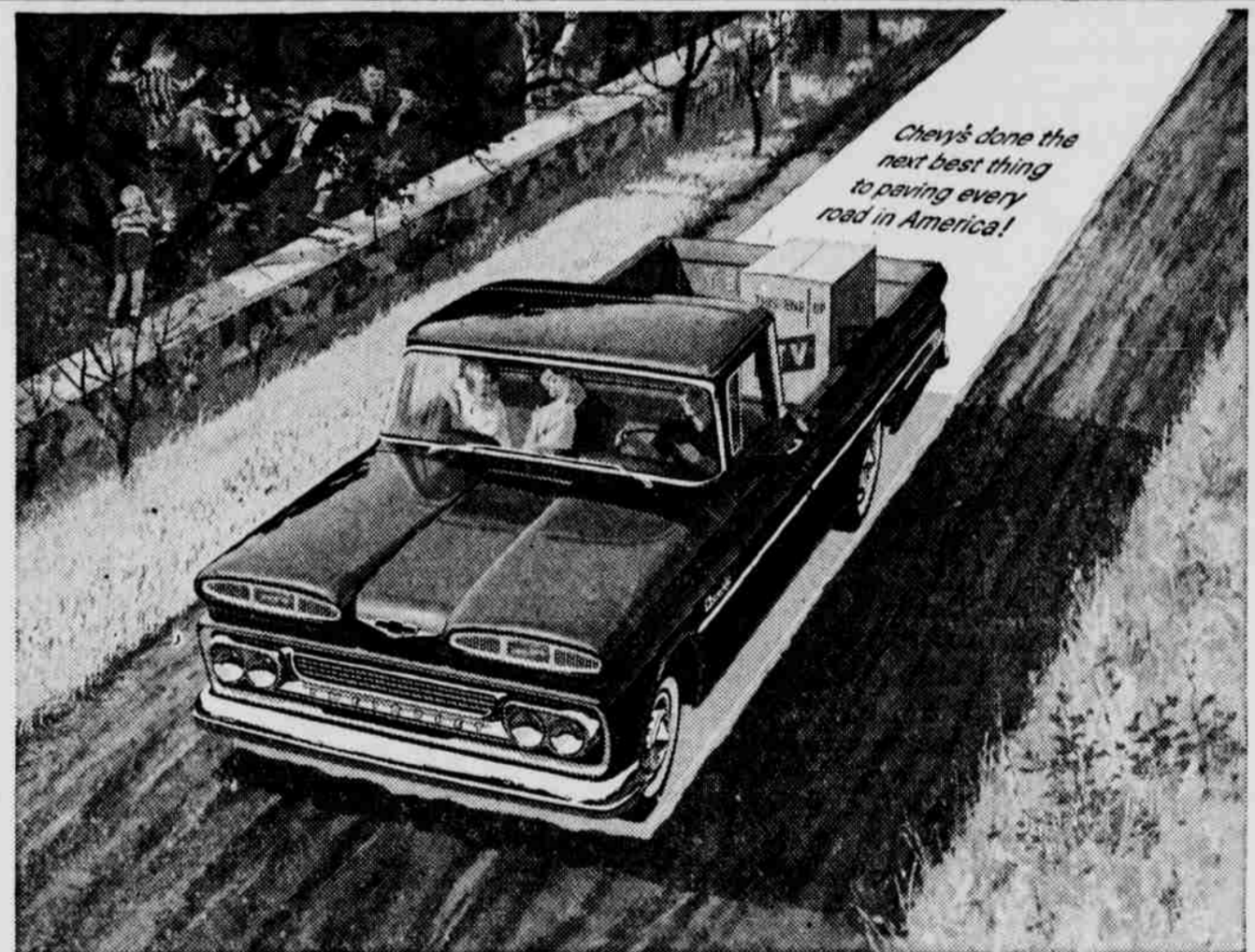
