When Traveling, Have Eagle Eye Out for Eagles

EAGLE (Special) — You can go from Palmyra to Eagle in just a little while but you would not necessarily wind up in Cass County.

A survey of the Atlas following a conversation with tourists shows there are three other Eagles. One, in Wisconsin with 402 population, is in about the same location compared with its neighbor Palmyra (pop. 862) as Eagle is in relation to Palmyra in Nebraska.

And, further observation shows there are 14 villages with an "Eagle prefix" — Eagleville, Eagle Butte, Eagle Nest, Eagle Town, Eagle Bend, Eagle Grove, Eagle Lake, Eagle Pals and Eagle Rock. There are three Eagle Lakes, in Maine, Texas and Florida, Eagle Rivers in Wisconsin and Michigan. Eagle, Idaho, has 250 population and Eagle, Colo., 445.

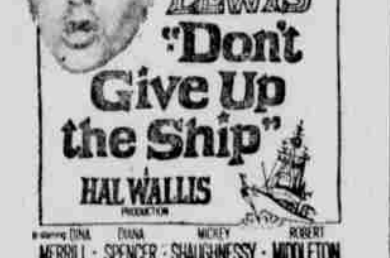
