The Dollars Flow Out

The Secretaries of State, Defense and the Treasury met recently in Washington to discuss the growing problem of overseas military cost.

The problem is becoming critical because of the U.S. deficit and the slowing flow of dollar expenditures overseas.

In the past eighteen months the U.S. trade balance has been—for the first time in decades—endangered, and even unbalanced by a flow of dollars out of the country. As a result of this, and high defense costs, consideration has been given to requesting allies overseas to underwrite part of the U. S. military outlay abroad.

Currently, the U. S. spends about three billion dollars maintaining its armed forces overseas. About half of this goes for operation and maintenance of bases, local payments, and construction. In these fields of expenditure it might be possible for allied nations to contribute something—if they so desired.

Considering the U. S. spends several billion dollars annually on foreign economic aid and the emergence of several allies in a stronger economic position, Washington is approaching the problem of overseas defense costs realistically, and, eventually, the U. S. expenditure will probably be lowered or co-operation from allied countries obtained.
