

## STATE AVERAGE BILLS - 250 KWH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE

The average monthly bill for 250 kilowatt hours of residential electric service in Nebraska is only \$6.23, according to a recent Federal Power Commission publication.



This is the lowest average bill paid in any of the states in the entire Midwest-Great Plains-Rocky Mountain region. It is the 5th lowest bill paid anywhere in the nation and com-pares with a national average of \$7.36.

Nebraska's industrial power rates are low, too. Based on a demand load of 500 kilowatts and monthly consumption of 200,000 KWH, the average bill in Nebraska is the lowest in the region, and 8th lowest in the nation.




