

Tall Crete Next PHS Assignment

Plattsmouth's Blue Devils, who took their lumps in a dogged cage battle with Nebraska City Tuesday night broken open in the closing minutes, have more hard work cut out for them Saturday night.

They travel to Crete for another Twin Rivers Conference game and will find one of their main difficulties, lack of all-around height, accentuated again.

Crete has not built an impressive record but it has tall, young team expected to improve greatly as the season progresses.

The game is Saturday night instead of the usual Friday because of a conflict with a Doane College game at Crete Friday night.

Plattsmouth Coach John Adkins says the word on Crete is that they're big and not too bad, despite several losses. Adkins isn't giving up one bit on his own squad, in spite of

Tuesday night's reversal. He believes the team is improving right along.

Main trouble against Nebraska City was "deep cold" spell of shooting in the third quarter when Nebraska City broke away from a halftime score favoring Plattsmouth, 20-19, going self take the lead, 34-28, going into the fourth quarter.

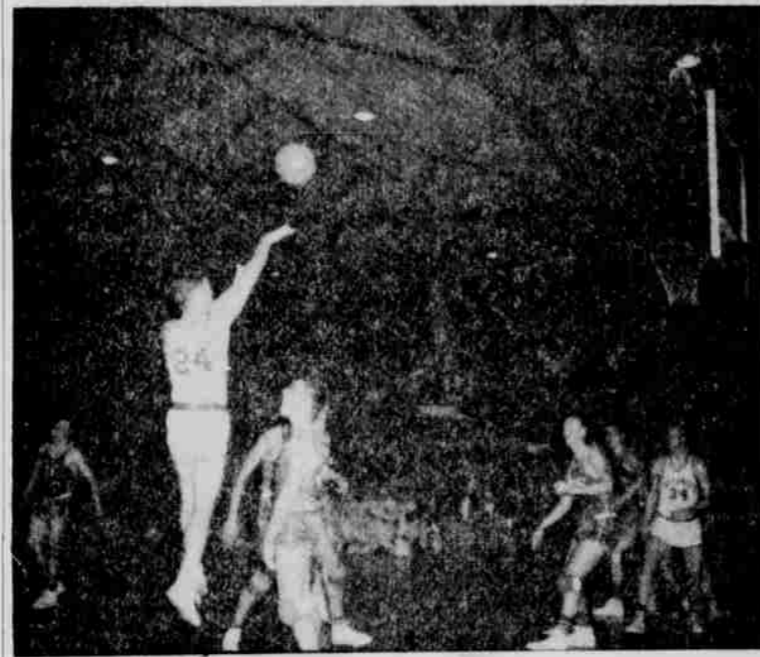
After that, Plattsmouth remained cold, getting only two field goals, and two free throws the last eight minutes. The Devils had to loosen up, too, to try to steal the ball as the Pioneers were content to play it slow and deliberate. That helped to enlarge the score.

For the second half (won by Nebraska City 32 to 14), the Blue Devils shot only .160 on four goals in 25 tries. In the same stretch, the Pioneers got 11 for 28, .392.

ter was big enough to keep the rebounding a continual uphill battle under both baskets for Plattsmouth.

Merrick County taxpayers can well agree with the letter of Nov. 30th to your fine paper in which Mr. Ralph Doud sets forth the need of Cass county for a trained highway engineer, graduated from a college or university and certified. We have none, contrary to Mr. Doud's writing, only a former farmer, serving as County engineer, at an exorbitant salary.

A trained engineer would not have built the bridge Mr. Doud mentioned as a \$12,500 saving on the ground that it is too long without turn outs, too narrow, and a great traffic hazard in foggy or icy weather. As it stands he would say there is a \$37,500 accident trap.

Cass and Merrick County each and both point up the need for corrective action by the next Legislature. Mr. Doud also must have spent his two days at our highway dept. building and should hurry to withdraw his expense offer to Central City.
