**Cass Theatre to Show "The Ten Commandments"**

Ten years of planning, three years of research and preliminary exploration and three years of writing preceded the actual shooting of Cecil B. DeMille's "The Ten Commandments," due Sun., Mon., Tues. and Wed., Feb. 14-15-16-17 at the Cass Theatre.

The painstaking research for the massive film, in which Charlton Heston portrays Moses and Yul Brynner Pharaoh Ramees II, not only guided the writing of the huge script but was used by all sixty-four departments of Paramount Pictures in designing the enormous sets, the 100,000 props, warurobe for two dozen stars and 25,000 extras, makeup and choreography.

Studied constantly were the King James and Douay Versions of the Holy Scriptures and "The Pentateuch and Hafforans," edited by the Chief Rabbi of the British Empire, but since Exodus omits thirty years of Moses' life, the Koran, the Midrash, "The Mishnah" and the works of Philo, Josephus and Eusebius were scoured to fill in the gap without departing from the Bible story.

In addition, DeMille's chief researcher, Henry S. Neorndinger, and screen writers Aenas MacKenzie, Jesse L. Lasky, Jr., Jack Garlas and Frederic M. Frank received invaluable assistance in supplementing their knowledge of Moses, the man, from leading museum directors, librarians and eminent antiquity experts throughout the world.

**Progress Made in Bid To Find Industrial Uses for Crops**

Nebraska's program to find industrial uses for agricultural products took several significant steps forward during the past week.

The Nebraska Agricultural Products Research Fund Committee was notified that it will receive at least \$200,000 in federal funds to supplement the \$300,000 to \$350,000 it will receive annually from the one-tenth mill tax levied for support of the committee's activities.

**Here's a Toothsome Tale**

The federal funds come from the old Nebraska Rural Rehabilitation Corporation, which was organized during the depression to receive and administer Federal Emergency Relief Administration.

In a move to secure information on two promising uses for corn, committee members, Vince Rossiter of Hartington and Maynard Jensen of Aurora, and Columbus businessman Raymond Arndt travelled to Chicago, Illinois where they were briefed on the use of corn coupled with petroleum to produce a whole new line of chemicals and on the work being done with high-amylase starch corns.

They reported that during their visit to the Universal Oil Products Co., an international petroleum refining research organization, they met and talked with Dr. Carl B. Linn, a native of Auburn, Nebraska, who is credited with discovery of the petroleum-corn derivative.

Dr. Linn, a research chemist, who still has farming interests at Auburn, said he envisions a whole new line of uses for his product which could use large quantities of corn in an economically feasible manufacturing process.

Dr. Linn said uses for the product might be found in constructing roads and runways or for detergents, cement finishing materials, pharmaceuticals, plastics and adhesives.

Research to develop marketable products is all that remains to be done to develop a large market for corn in this area, he indicated.

At American Maize Co. of Roby, Indiana, the committee members were briefed on the status of high-amylase starch corns.

Clifford Hullinger, a research chemist, told the group that his company intends to raise 1,000 acres of 55 percent amylose seed corn this year in cooperation with the National Starch Company.

Hullinger said that a large market already exists for the starch from high-amylase corns and that one company had purchased all the high-amylase starch on the market last year. The starch is easily extracted in conventional starch processing plants using existing equipment, he said.

There is a good possibility that Nebraska can help remove the see-corn bottleneck from the production of high-amylase corns in quantities, the committee was told.

Eleven members of the Plattsmouth Chapter of Future Farmers of America took part in the Duroc breeders state judging contest at Fremont Feb. 8.

Schools from Eastern Nebraska took part in the contest. Charles Stoehr of Plattsmouth was the contest's high individual scorer.

He was also on the team that took second place. Others on the second place team are Bob Akins, Arlan Cundall and Bob Hill.
