Down Memory Lane

10 YEARS AGO

Residents of school district No. 56, comprising the Murray schools, by a vote of 20 to 18, decided to discontinue the present school system at the close of the year. It was voted to have the school carried on as an eighth grade school. The school has operated as a two grade high school carrying the ninth and tenth grades—Bill Knorr has purchased the residence in Hillcrest formerly owned by R. R. Furse and will move in a few days. The Furse family have purchased the Wayne Gorton property on Second Avenue—Weeping Water held their athletic banquet at the Cass County auditorium. The banquet was honored by Bill Glassford, athletic director of the University of Nebraska and Sam Vanconti, outstanding athletic and coach at Fairbury. Coach P. H. Hines of Weeping Water presented trophies and awards to members of the football squad comprising David Dennis and Jerry Joyce, co-captains, Terry Bickford, Lanny Ludwick, Dale Gray, Marvin Friesel, Doyle Parsons, John Everett, Lyle Thomassen, Tom Albert, John Stone, Richard Keckler, Lloyd Bouton, Charles Baker, Delune Amick, Duane Burgen, Corkey Kinney, Jack Norris and Richard Gibson—W. P. O'Donnell was elected as president of the local league of Eagles. Mr. O'Donnell is currently state worthy chaplain of the order—C. E. Metzger of Cedar Creek filed with the secretary of state as candidate for the unicameral. He has previous service as representative from Cass county in the session of 1911 of the two house legislature—Joe Mrasek, 62, sheriff of Cass county was found dead in his apartment in the Bates building, apparently passing away in his

sleep. He was elected sheriff in 1939 and served for eight years in that office—Contract was let at the Masonic Temple in Omaha for the erection of a new addition to the Masonic Home in this city.

30 YEARS AGO

Municipal election in Weeping Water showed Troy L. Davis victor over Dr. W. H. Tuck, 118 to 103. G. L. Spohn was elected city clerk, C. V. Wallick, city treasurer; J. L. Wiles, and H. A. Crozier as councilmen. A. J. Patterson was named police judge. In Nehawka the question of the village voting \$25,000 for the construction of a large well and water system submitted. The vote was very close, 47 voting for the plant and 46 against. It is expected a special election will be held in the summer to vote on the bond issue. J. H. Steffens and J. J. Pollard were selected on the board of village trustees, Nick Klaurens as police judge and J. W. Murdoch and G. C. Hoback as members of the school board—Missouri river was reported as cutting into the low lands east of Rock Bluff, land that had formed from deposits of the river through the years—Plattsmouth Woman's club is urging that Memorial trees be planted along highway 75 leading into this city, honoring the men of the community that had given their service in the world war. It is estimated that from 300 to 350 trees would be necessary to complete the highway of memory. Many have urged that Lombardy Poplars, so familiar in France be placed along the highway—Plattsmouth lodge 739 BPOE installed officers for the year, Hilt Martin exalted ruler; Dr. J. A. Griffin, leading knight; W. T. Distel, loyal knight; Carl P. Ofc, lecturing knight; James W. Holmes, secretary; Charles K. Bestor, treasurer; Fred Sydebotham, Tyler, W. M. Barclay, trustees. Exalted Ruler Martin announced the appointment of Dr. R. P. Westover as chaplain, John E. Turner, esquire, Charles Bester, inner guard—Clyde Jackson, watchman at the Lyman-Richey sandpits, detected a party of four men rowing across the Platte river, headed for the sand pits. Later the men were found around the large and expensive copper cable used in the plant operation. Sheriff Bert Reed was out to investigate but was unable to locate any signs of the men. Jackson stated the men looked like Mexicans—in the track meet at Nebraska City Chet Wiles of Plattsmouth tied with Trotter of Nebraska City in the 440 yard dash, the two setting a new record 55.4. In the 220 low hurdles Gilbert Hirz was winner by the time of 31.5. McCleary of Plattsmouth was second, Maynard of Nebraska City third. Garland McCleary scored first in high jump and pole vault, making the high jump in five feet and the pole vault at eight feet. Clarence Forbes was second in the pole vault and high jump. George Winscot was winner of the javelin throw with a distance of 123.9 feet. Trively of Plattsmouth was third in the 100 yard and 220 dash.

City Council Minutes

Meeting of March 28, 1960
Council Chambers City Hall
Special meeting of the City Council was held pursuant to the call of the Mayor and published notices at 7:30 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of opening and tabulating bids on the furnishing of labor, tools, material and equipment in connection with the construction of a sanitary outlet sewer and sewage disposal plant and to transact any other business that may come before the council.
The following were present: Mayor Grant Roberts, Councilmen L. W. Moore, A. W. Huebner, Wm. G. Highfield, C. W. Rhylander, City Clerk Albert Olson. Absent: none.
Two bids were received and upon opening the bids were found to be from Smith & Risman Co. of Des Moines, Ia. and Parson's Construction Co. of Omaha, Neb.
Bids were referred to Engineer's for tabulation, after tabulation and discussion it was recommended by the Engineer's that all bids be rejected and readvertised for bids.
