June 28, 1960 Geometric patterns of steel and concrete rising towards the sky mark construction progress.


By the calendar, Consumers Public Power District's Sheldon Station near Hallam, Nebraska, is now approximately half-way to completion.

In the past two years, the Station has been converted from a naked hillside to a complex of nearly completed buildings. Many pieces of equipment, including the 100,000 kilowatt turbo-generator, have been set in place.

In another two years, production of electric power from the nuclear heat source is scheduled to begin. In the meantime, in the spring of 1961, the plant's conventional steam facilities will already have gone on the line.

Completion of Sheldon Station will open a new era for Nebraska. The plant not only will supply a new source of needed electric power, but it will open great new potentials for economic growth.
