A MEASURE TO amend the Nebraska Constitution Article IV, Section 1 to provide for election of a Commissioner of Education by non-political ballot in November, 1962, and every four years thereafter; to conform the election date for the other elective state executive officers to provide the Nebraska laws and constitutional provisions relating to the State Department of Education, State Board of Education and present Commissioner of Education shall apply to the elected Commissioner of Education to repeal Sections 14, 15, 16 and 17 of Article VII of said Constitution effective upon the election and qualification of said Commissioner.

TEXT OF PROPOSED INITIATIVE PETITION
Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

"Amend Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska to read as follows: "Sec. 1. The executive officers of the state shall be the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Attorney General, Commissioner of Education, and the head of such other executive departments as set forth herein or as may be established by law. The Legislature shall provide for the placing of the above named officers as heads over such departments of Government as it may by law establish. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, and the Treasurer shall be chosen at the general election held in November, 1962, and in each even-numbered year thereafter, and their term of office shall be two years and until their successors shall be elected and qualified."

The Commissioner of Education shall be chosen on a non-political ballot at the general election held in November, 1962, and every four years thereafter until his successor shall be elected and qualified. The records, books, and papers of all executive officers shall be kept at the seat of government, and such officers, excepting the Lieutenant Governor, shall reside there during their respective terms of office. Officers in the executive department of the state shall perform such duties as may be provided by law. The heads of all executive departments established by law, other than those to be elected as provided herein, shall be appointed by the Governor, with the consent of a majority of all the members elected to the Legislature, but officers so appointed may be removed by the Governor. Subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the heads of the various executive or civil departments shall have power to appoint and remove all subordinate employees in their respective departments.

"Add one new section, to amend Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as Section 29, and to read as follows:

"All provisions in the Constitution of the State of Nebraska and laws of the state relating to the State Department of Education, the State Board of Education, and the Commissioner of Education, shall insofar as such provisions are applicable, apply to and mean the Commissioner of Education, as provided for in this Article.

"Repeal Sections 14, 15, 16 and 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, said repeal to become effective upon the election and qualification of the Commissioner of Education provided for in Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as amended."

City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska Ordinance No. 996 Annual Appropriation Bill AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFray BY MEANS OF TAXES THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF PLATTSBOUTH, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING APRIL 30, 1961; SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS OR PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; CONTAINING THE PERCENTAGE OR NUMBER OF MILLS LEVIED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; LEVYING A \$2-00 POLL TAX UPON EACH AND EVERY ABLEDODGED MALE RESIDENT OF THE CITY NOT EXEMPT BY LAW; PROVIDING FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, Section 1. Annual Appropriation Bill 1960 Made; Mill Levy For each object or purpose. There are hereby appropriated the following sums of money deemed necessary to defray by means of taxation all the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska for the fiscal year ending April 30, 1961, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of tax authorized to be levied. The objects or purposes for which such expenditures are to be made, the amount appropriated for each object or purpose and the corresponding percentage or number of mills levied for each object or purpose based on the total tax value of \$4,869,859.00 returned for said fiscal year, including all amounts due upon legal and valid outstanding bonds against said City and all special assessments and other taxes authorized by law, as specified as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 995
AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 150 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSBOUTH, NEBRASKA; DEFINING ITS BOUNDARIES AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF A CERTAIN STREET BY PAVING AND SUCH OTHER WORK AS MAY BE INCIDENTAL THERE TO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska: SECTION 1. The Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth in the County of Cass, State of Nebraska, hereby find and declare that it is to the best interests of the said city to create street improvement district No. 150.

SECTION 2. There is hereby created within the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska a street improvement district to be known and designated as Street Improvement District No. 150, the outer boundaries of which are as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the West property line of Lot 3 in Block 96 in the Original City of Plattsmouth and the South property line of Avenue E, also known as Walnut Street; thence East on the North property line of Lot 3 in said Block 96 extended to the West line of Seventh Street; thence North on the

West line of Seventh Street to the North line of Avenue E, also known as Walnut Street; thence East on the North property line of Avenue E, also known as Walnut Street, extended to the intersection of the East property line of Lot 4 in Block 95 extended to its intersection with the South property line of Lot 4 in Block 4 in the City of Plattsmouth; thence West on the South property line of Lot 4 in Block 4 in the City of Plattsmouth extended to the intersection of the West property line of Lot 3 in Block 5 in the City of Plattsmouth; thence North on the West property line of Lot 3 in Block 5 in the City of Plattsmouth, extended to the point of beginning.

SECTION 3. The following street within said Street Improvement District shall be and hereby is ordered improved by paving, grading and work incidental thereto:

SEVENTH STREET from the North line of the alley running through Blocks 4 and 5 in the City of Plattsmouth extended and North on said Seventh Street to the North property line of Avenue E, also known as Walnut Street together with all included intersections.

All work incidental to or necessarily essential for the construction of said improvements shall be done in connection therewith as a part thereof.

SECTION 4. All of said improvements shall be constructed to the established grades as fixed by ordinance of said city and shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications to be made by Henningson, Durham and Richardson, Inc., Special Engineers employed by the City and to be approved by the Council. Said improvements shall be made at public cost but special improvement assessments shall be levied on the specially benefited property to reimburse the City to the extent provided by law.

The Post Office Department has had marked success in its continuing efforts to have people put a return address on their envelopes. One big boost for the Department's campaign was convincing the etiquette book authors - such as Amy Vanderbilt and Emily Post - that they should recommend return addresses on social correspondence.

The Post Office now estimates that 92 per cent of letters contain a return address, up considerably from 10 and 20 years ago.

The story is told in Washington of the Senator who was campaigning around his state. He spoke to every conceivable audience under any and all conditions.

One day he spoke at an auction of used farm machinery, and the only podium from which he could see and be seen was a manure spreader. He began his speech with these words: "Fellow Americans, I've campaigned the length and breadth of this State; I've met the people everywhere. But this is the first time I have spoken on my opponent's platform."

Four former Omahans are now Representatives: Ray J. Madden now represents Gary, Ind., but served as an Omaha municipal judge in 1916 and earlier received his law degree from Creighton University.

Walter H. Judd is now from Minneapolis but was born in Rising City, Neb., and attended the University of Nebraska in Lincoln and the medical college in Omaha. He and Madden are both serving their ninth terms in the House.

Gerald R. Ford was born in Omaha but moved to Michigan as a boy. He is now from Grand Rapids and serving his sixth term.

Robert R. Barry was also born in Omaha: He now represents Yonkers, N. Y., and is in his first term.

Other lawmakers have Nebraska ties: both Senator Gale McGee (Wyo.) and Representative John Kyl (Iowa) spent many years in our State. Representative Wayne Aspinall of Colorado married Julia Kuns of Lincoln more than 40 years ago. He is now chairman of the Interior Committee.
