

Simmer ½ cup diced onion in ¼ cup butter. Combine with 1 can Cream of Mushroom soup and one can milk, 1 small can mushrooms (juice and all), I can corned beef, crumbled, plus blanched spaghetti. Mix lightly; fold in 1/4 lb. grated cheese. Place in buttered casserole. Sprinkle 1 cup buttered


