Plattsmouth fans can get a free look at the 1960 Plattsmouth High football squad Friday night here.

It's 1960 Football Preview at the school athletic field with an intra-squad game scheduled to start at 7:30.

Coach Bill Hawkins and his staff has been working with a squad ranging to 51 boys to get ready for this initial test and the season's opener, here Sept. 9 against Tecumseh.

Practice has been held daily except Sunday since Aug. 22. The first date organized sessions could be held by state high schools.

Bogus Check Passer Caught

A man wanted in three different states on bogus checks was arrested Tuesday afternoon near Union by State Patrolman Harold Legrade.

The man with many aliases is Richard Thomas Scott, 36 most recently of Belleville, Ill.
