



els per acre. This compared with an average yield of 17 bushels for seedings made Nov. 25; 13 bushels from Feb. 13 scedings; seven bushels for seedings made on March 1 and no yield for the March 25 seeding date.

No complete failures were noted for fall or late winter plantings Swinbank revealed. Yields obtained from the March 1 planting date ranged from zero to 25 bushels per acre.
