THE DRIVER'S SEAT

You've got to give the kids credit. In spite of dramatic headline stories about juvenile delinquents, most of today's teenagers are a level-headed lot whose sound thinking often puts adults to shame.

For example, American Youth magazine invited teenagers to submit comments on the advisability of requiring driver-training courses as a prelude to obtaining drivers' licenses. The responses revealed that teenagers — some of them at least — have arrived through independent thinking at conclusions that parallel those of leading traffic safety experts.

One 17-year-old girl went directly to the core of the problem when she wrote, "A driver training course should be required for obtaining a driver's license because it would ultimately eliminate all poorly trained drivers from the highways. Driver training obtained from a relative or friend is unreliable as well as dangerous, unless that person is a qualified instructor and unless the training takes place in a dual-control car."

"A driver education course has many benefits to offer the future driver," the youngster continued. "Since the course is given over a period of a few months, the length of time is adequate to give the student a thorough understanding of the automobile and how it operates."

Another teenager wrote that the most important lesson taught in high school driver training courses is the necessity for acquiring the right attitude for safe driving, something safety authorities have had difficulty in impressing on adult drivers.

One youngster wrapped the whole subject up in a manner worthy of the most thoughtful of adults. "As a result of driver training, young adults are better equipped to take on the tremendous responsibility of driving a car," he wrote, "and the percentage of accidents among teen-agers is greatly reduced."

Cash Benefits For Disabled Under Age 50

Totally disabled workers of any age are now eligible to apply for disability insurance benefits if they meet insured requirements of the Social Security Act, according to A. F. Silber, manager of the Lincoln Social Security District Office.

The Lincoln office has completed applications for more than 90 disabled persons under age 50 who had applied for a wage freeze under the previous law. In addition, applications have been filed for more than 60 dependent children and 20 wives with children in their care. Benefits for a disabled person can range from \$33 to \$119 and for a family from \$49.50 to \$254 a month.

First payments to disabled persons under age 50 and their dependents are now being made for the month of October. Any person under age 65 who is totally disabled and has had 5 years of work under social security in the last ten years may apply for benefits if he has been disabled 6 months or more. Applications may be filed at the District Office, Room 400, National Bank of Commerce Building, Lincoln, or at contact stations in any county seat. Scheduled dates and locations of contact stations may be found in any post office or bank.

High-Producing Cows 3 Times As Profitable

LINCOLN — Dairy cows that produce 12,881 pounds of milk and 459 pounds of butterfat were about three times profitable as cows that produced 5,120 pounds of milk and 244 pounds of butterfat.

According to the annual summary of Nebraska Dairy Herd Improvement Association, the higher producing cows returned \$337 in the value of product over feed cost while the lower producing cows returned \$132, said C. W. Nibler, Extension dairyman at the University of Nebraska.

"Not only were returns much greater for the higher producing cows, but the better cows marketed more feed for their owners. For example, the lower producing cows are \$119 worth of feed during the year while the higher producing cows consumed \$171 worth of feed," he said.

As production increases, the feed cost gradually increases but the returns above feed costs increase much more rapidly. Cows that produced 5,120 pounds of milk returned to their owners \$2.10 for every dollar's worth of feed they consumed while cows that produced 12,881 pounds of milk returned \$2.97 for each dollar's worth of feed consumed. A complete summary of Nebraska's dairy production testing program is available at the Extension dairyman's Office at the College of Agriculture.

Nibler said dairy production records now being computed by electronic data processing machines at regional computing centers provide tremendous information to help the dairyman secure greater returns. This information shows daily feed costs, returns above feed costs, feed costs per one hundred pounds of milk, and pounds of milk produced per worker on a daily and yearly basis every month.

What is the normal path of high pressure areas across the United States? Do you know whether your home is on one of the "main routes?"

With fall coming on and more high pressure areas expected, it is good to know the path of these fair-weather systems. Generally speaking, they always travel east. They move in over the United States from California, and that vicinity and move almost due east, in the southern part of the country.

Some cross in near the Washington and Philadelphia. Others come in over the Great Lakes region and move out to sea above New York.

Cold systems, unlike warm fronts, move generally downward, slightly, as they cross the country. Their center seldom crosses lower Texas or Florida peninsula. From now through the winter you will experience more and more of them.
